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





the character inhabited by Tseng but, instead, they serve as evidence of a dignitary's visit to famous places. The Mao suit, also known in China as the Zhongshan suit, was first worn by Chinese revolutionary, Sun Yat-sen, before

Chairman Mao Zedong popularized the uniform in 1949 as a symbol of unity and conformity. Many aspects of the suit down to the cuff buttons and pocket flaps are symbolic of the Chinese Communist Party's (CCP) values. For example, the four pockets represent propriety, justice, honesty and shame, signifying the Four Cardinal Principles from I Ching, The Book of Changes." In time for the holidays!
